INTRODUCTION

- 1. The 2nd meeting of the Working Groups on Migration and Development was held from 12th-14th May 2008 in Praia (Republic of Cape Verde)

OPENING SESSION

4. In his opening statement, Mr. Severino de Almeida, Secretary General of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Cape Verde, on behalf of

immigrants. Lastly, he indicated that his country is available to share experiences with ECOWAS member states in this domain.

- 7. In his contribution, Mr. Nfaly Sanoh, Director of the Departmen of Free Movement of persons of the ECOWAS Commission, on behalf of the Commissioner for Trade, Customs and Free Movement of Persons of the Commission, expressed his profound gratitude to the Cape Verdian Authorities for their warm welcome of participants as well a for the facilities put at their disposal for the successful holding of the meeting.
- 8. Discussing the ECOWAS common approach to immigration, he emphasized that migration within the Sub- region is more important than migration to Europe or other places.
- He also hoped that the meeting will discuss, among other things the following issues:
 - The brain drain that is contributing to the degradation of the socio- economic fabric of the countries of origin
 - The observation of the links between migration and the Diaspora, regular and irregular migration, free movement and regional integrations
 - The contribution of the Diaspora to the development of countries of origin etc.
- 10. Lastly, he urged the participants to seriously consider all the topics and other issues that might be raised in the course of discussions relating to problems of migration, highlighting those that

should be prioritized by ECOWAS for the next few years, to be implemented with the support of Development Partners

- 13. After the opening ceremony, the Cape Verde delegation made a presentation on its experience regarding the strategy for the mobilization of skills and competences from the Diaspora for the purpose of development.
- 14. The discussions that followed shed light on certain aspects of migration as it affects the development of the countries of origin. It was unanimously recognized that the Cape-Verdian experience is a source of inspiration in the management of migration.
