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Update on budgets and funding for 2014 and 2015

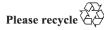
Summary

The final annual budget for 2014 amounted to \$6,569.7 million. This represents a total increase of \$1,261.9 million when compared to the original annual budget of \$5,307.8 million approved by the Executive Committee at its sixty-fourth session in October 2013, and a \$333.5 million increase when compared to the revised annual budget of \$6,236.2 million approved by the Executive Committee at its sixty-fifth session in October 2014.

Expenditure for 2014 is estimated at \$3,344.0 million. While this figure is preliminary as the closure of accounts for 2014 is not yet finalized, the unmet needs represent \$3,225.7 million or 49 per cent of the total budget.

For the budget year 2015, the original budget approved by the Executive Committee at its sixty-fourth session amounted to \$5,179.5 million, which was revised to \$6,234.4 million by the Committee at its sixty-fifth session. As at 31 January 2015, six supplementary budgets, totalling \$750.4 million, had been established. The budget was also adjusted downwards by \$158.4 million in the Middle East and North Africa region. Consequently, as at 31 January 2015, the current budget for 2015 amounted to \$6,826.4 million.

A draft decision on the overall budgets and funding for 2014 and 2015 is provided in annex IX.



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I. Introduction

1. The present document provides information on financial implementation against the 2014 budget as well as funding availability as at 31 January 2015. As the closure of accounts for 2014 is not yet finalized, the figures presented for 2014 are provisional. This document also provides the requirements estimated for 2015 as at 31 January 2015¹.

- The 2014 budget and funding situation are summarized in annex I.
- Annexes II and III provide lists of transfers from the 2014 operational reserve and from the 2014 "new or additional activities mandate-related" reserve.
- Annex IV shows the breakdown of the 2014 supplementary budgets established during the financial period ended 31 December 2014.
- Annex V shows overall contributions received and recorded for the period ended 31 December 2014.
- A breakdown of contributions from non-governmental organizations (NGOs), foundations and private donors is provided in annex VI.
- Annex VII shows the pillar breakdown of the current 2015 budget, including supplementary budgets established after approval by the Executive Committee.
- Annex VIII shows the latest available statistics for populations of concern to UNHCR (most figures are as of mid-2014).
- Annex IX provides the draft decision on budgets and funding for 2014 and 2015.

2. The final budget and expenditure figures for 2014 will be confirmed following the closure of accounts, expected on 31 March 2015.

II. Budgets and funding for 2014

3. The Executive Committee, at its sixty-fourth session in October 2013, approved the original annual budget for 2014 amounting to \$5,307.8 million² (annex I, table A, column 5). In October 2014, at its sixty-fifth session, the Executive Committee approved the revised annual budget of \$6,236.2 million³. As at 31 December 2014, the final annual budget for 2014 reached \$6,569.7 million (annex I, table A, column 10), comprising eight supplementary budgets established during the course of the year to address unforeseen needs, for a total amount of \$1,261.9 million.

4. As of 31 January 2015, prior to the closure of the 2014 accounts, the total funding available in 2014 was estimated at \$3,603.5 million, comprising: 1) funds carried over from the budget year 2013 in the amount of \$262.3 million; 2) voluntary contributions received and pledged, amounting to \$3,337.7 million, including the contribution of \$45.6 million from the regular budget of the United Nations; and 3) a provisional amount for other income and adjustments estimated at \$3.5 million.

5. The final 2014 budget comprises programmed activities of \$6,233.0 million (including provisions for administrative costs at headquarters covered in part by the United Nations regular budget contribution); an operational reserve of \$305.7 million; a "new or additional activities - mandate-related" reserve of \$19.0 million; and \$12.0 million for Junior Professional Officers (JPOs) – annex I, table A, column 10.

6. Expenditure for 2014 is estimated at \$3,344.0 million. With an estimated \$3,603.5 million in funds available as at 31 December 2014, the projected carry-over into 2015 is expected to be in the order of \$259.5 million.

7. At the sixty-first meeting of the Standing Committee in September 2014, UNHCR reported that six supplementary budgets, totalling \$1,026.1 million, had been established as at July 2014. Thereafter, there were increases in three supplementary budgets (for the emergency response in South Sudan, the Iraq situation and the Central Africa Republic situation), totalling \$208.6 million, while two new supplementary budgets were established for the Nigeria situation (\$16.6 million) and for the response to the needs of internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Ukraine (\$10.6 million). These upward adjustments, totalling \$235.8 million, brought the overall total in supplementary budgets for 2014 to \$1,261.9 million.

III. Projections for 2015

9. At its sixty-fourth session in October 2013, the Executive Committee approved the original annual budget of \$5,179.5 million⁴ for 2015. In October 2014, at its sixty-fifth session, the Executive Committee approved the revised annual budget of \$6,234.4 million⁵. As at 31 January 2015, six supplementary budgets (for the Iraq, Nigeria, Ukraine, South Sudan and Pakistan (North Waziristan) situations, as well as for the Ebola response), totalling \$750.4 million, had been established. There was also a reduction in the Middle East and North Africa region of \$158.4 million, following a revision of the Regional Refugee Response Plan and the Syria Refugee Plan, in view of the lower than expected refugee population growth in Jordan and Lebanon in 2015. The net increase of \$592.0 million has brought the current budget to \$6,826.4 million (annex VII, column 10).

11. Donor response at UNHCR's pledging conference held in December 2014 confirmed sustained commitment to supporting vital programmes, although the total amount pledged was lower than what was pledged the previous year. Additionally, recent currency fluctuations will affect UNHCR in 2015, as a large percentage of the organization's revenue is received in currencies that strongly devaluated, such as the Euro, in relation to its primary currency of expenditure, the United States Dollar.

12. While UNHCR is currently looking at ways to minimize the impact on refugees and other persons of concern, this is happening at a time when we continue to face growing needs as a result of new and protracted emergencies. Given this situation, donors are encouraged to respond generously to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet the revised 2015 annual budget.

Annex IX

Draft decision on budgets and funding for 2014 and 2015

The Standing Committee,

Recalling the Executive Committee's decisions on administrative, financial and programme matters at its sixty-fourth and sixty-fifth sessions, (A/AC.96/1132, para. 15 and A/AC.96/1143, para. 13 respectively) as well as its discussions under the programme budgets and funding item at the sixty-first meeting of the Standing Committee in September 2014,

Reaffirming the importance of international burden and responsibility-sharing in reducing the burden on countries hosting refugees, especially developing ones,

Recalls that the Executive Committee, at its sixty-fourth session, approved original programmes and budgets for regional programmes, global programmes and headquarters under UNHCR's 2014-2015 biennial programme budget, amounting to \$5,307.8 million and \$5,179.5 million for 2014 and 2015 respectively;

Recalls that the Executive Committee, at its sixty-fifth session, approved revised programmes and budgets for regional programmes, global programmes and headquarters under UNHCR's 2014-2015 biennial programme budget (revised), amounting to \$6,236.2 million and \$6,234.4 million for 2014 and 2015 respectively;

Notes that the 2014 supplementary budgets amounted to \$1,261.9 million for programmes benefiting refugees and internally displaced persons;

Takes note of the increase in UNHCR's 2014 annual budget to a final total of \$6,569.7 million;

Notes that the 2015 supplementary budgets currently amount to \$750.4 million for programmes benefiting refugees and internally displaced persons;

Notes the reduction of \$158.4 million in the Middle East and North Africa region for 2015;

Takes note of the increase in UNHCR's 2015 annual budget to a current total of \$6,826.4 million;

Recognizes that emergencies and unforeseen activities unfolding in 2015 may result in the need for additional or expanded supplementary budgets, and that additional resources, over and above those for existing budgets, would be needed to meet such needs; and

Urges Member States to continue to respond generously, in a spirit of solidarity and in a timely manner, to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet in full the 2015 annual budget.
