Quatre-vingt-sixième réunion****Actualisation des budgets et du financement (2022 et 2023)***Résumé*

À sa soixante-douzième session plénière en octobre 2021, le Comité exécutif a approuvé le budget annuel initial de 8 993,7 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2022.

En 2022, quatre budgets supplémentaires s'élevant au total à 1 720,3 millions de dollars E.-U. ont été établis pour les situations en Afghanistan, au Cameroun, au Pakistan et en Ukraine, ce qui a porté le total du budget final de 2022 à 10 714 millions de dollars E.-U. au 31 décembre 2022.

Le budget initial de 2023, approuvé en octobre 2022 par le Comité exécutif à sa soixante-treizième session plénière, s'élevait à 10 211,3 millions de dollars E.-U. Depuis lors, deux budgets supplémentaires ont été établis, pour un montant total de 305,8 millions de dollars E.-U. pour les situations au Pakistan et en Ukraine. Le budget initial pour l'opération en Iraq a été réduit de 100 millions de dollars E.-U. afin d'aligner l'empreinte opérationnelle du HCR sur la stratégie de transition des Nations Unies dans le pays. Le total du budget actuel de 2023 s'élève à 10 417,1 millions de dollars E.-U.

En attendant la clôture des comptes annuels de 2022, le total provisoire des fonds disponibles pour 2022 s'élève à 6 130,6 millions de dollars E.-U., tandis que le chiffre provisoire des dépenses est de 5 599,3 millions de dollars E.-U. La comparaison du budget annuel final de 2022 au montant provisoire des fonds disponibles dégage un déficit financier de 4 583,4 millions de dollars E.-U., soit 42,8 %.

Un projet de décision sur les budgets et le financement pour 2022 et 2023 figure en annexe IX.

## I. Introduction

1. Le présent document fait une première mise à jour sur le budget de 2022.<sup>1</sup> Les comptes n'ayant pas encore été clôturés au moment de sa rédaction, tous les chiffres de fin d'année pour 2022 sont provisoires. Le document donne également un aperçu des besoins budgétaires estimatifs de 2023 au 31 janvier 2023.

- Les budgets annuels initial et final et les dépenses provisoires de 2022 sont résumés dans l'annexe I.
- Les annexes II a) et II b) présentent les transferts de la réserve des opérations pour 2022 et 2023.
- Les annexes III a) et III b) donnent un aperçu des budgets supplémentaires par situation, région et domaine d'impact pour 2022 et 2023.
- L'annexe IV montre les contributions générales enregistrées pour 2022.
- L'annexe V fournit la répartition par pays en 2022 des contributions des organisations non gouvernementales, des fondations et des donateurs privés.
- L'annexe VI présente la liste des contributions volontaires non affectées ou légèrement affectées en 2022.
- L'annexe VII montre les budgets annuels initial et actuel de 2023 au 31 janvier 2023.
- L'annexe VIII présente les toutes dernières statistiques provisoires (mi-2022) des personnes relevant de la compétence du HCR par pays/territoire d'asyle.
- En annexe IX figure le projet de décision sur les budgets et le financement pour 2022 et 2023.

2. Le budget annuel final, les chiffres relatifs aux financements et aux dépenses de 2022, qui seront disponibles à la suite de la clôture des comptes le 31 mars 2023, seront annoncés en juin 2023 à la quatre-vingt-septième réunion du Comité permanent.

## II. Budgets et financement pour 2022

### Budget total

3. À sa soixante-douzième session plénière en octobre 2021, le Comité exécutif a approuvé le budget annuel initial de 8 993,7 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2022<sup>2</sup>. Le budget final de 2022, chiffré à 10 714 millions de dollars E.-U., représente la somme du budget initial de 8 993,7 millions de dollars et des budgets supplémentaires de 1 720,3 millions de dollars E.-U., établis par le Haut-Commissaire en 2022 conformément à l'article 7.4<sup>3</sup> du Règlement de gestion du HCR. De plus amples informations sur le budget final 2022 sont fournies dans l'annexe I.

### Budgets supplémentaires

4. À la quatre-vingt-cinquième réunion du Comité permanent en septembre 2022, trois budgets supplémentaires ont été approuvés, s'élevant au total à 1 710,3 millions de dollars E.-U., comprenant 1 417,6 pour la situation en Ukraine ; 233,9 millions de dollars E.-U. millions de dollars E.-U. pour la situation en Afghanistan en réponse aux besoins humanitaires cruciaux des déplacés internes ; 59,6 millions de dollars E.-U. pour renforcer la réponse d'urgence au Cameroun et au Tchad dans le cadre de la situations au Cameroun. Par la suite, un budget supplémentaire de 10 millions de dollars E.-U. a été établi en réponse aux

inondations provoquées par la mousson au Pakistan. ce qui porte le total final des supplémentaires à 1 720,3 millions de dollars E.-U. au 31 décembre 2022. Le tableau II.1 ci-dessous présente un aperçu des budgets supplémentaires par situation. Une répartition plus détaillée des budgets supplémentaires de 2022 par situation, région et domaine d'impact est fournie dans l'annexe III a).

### Bilan provisoire des programmes

5. En 2022, le nombre de personnes déplacées de force a franchi la barre de 103 millions. Le HCR a répondu à des situations d'urgence complexes et à haut risque dans 32 pays, avec 52 déclarations internes de situation d'urgence, dont 35 nouvellement déclarées. Le déploiement d'environ 500 experts a permis d'apporter en temps voulu un appui à plusieurs opérations, notamment en Éthiopie, en Somalie, au Soudan du Sud, en Ukraine et dans les pays voisins. Dans ce contexte, le HCR a renforcé ses efforts en modernisant ses systèmes, processus et politiques relatifs aux technologies de l'information et en les adaptant au milieu évolutif dans lequel il intervient.

6. Dans le contexte du conflit armé en Ukraine, le HCR a fourni rapidement de l'assistance aux personnes nécessiteuses, avec notamment une distribution ciblée d'abris et de produits de première nécessité, l'accès aux soins de santé, d'initiative de prévention et de protection contre les violences liées au genre, d'intervention pour la nutrition, l'accès aux services d'eau, d'assainissement et d'hygiène, ainsi que de protection. La majeure partie des dépenses provisoires de 857,4 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la situation en Ukraine relève des domaines impact 2 (répondre) et 1 (protéger) représentant respectivement 94,1 % et 4,4 %, surtout pour l'assistance en espèces à buts multiples et la distribution d'articles non alimentaires.

### Analyse financière provisoire en fin d'année

7. La répartition par domaine d'impact du budget final de 2022, s'élevant à 10 714 millions de dollars E.-U. est présentée au tableau II.2 ci-dessous.

8. Le budget final de 2022, s'élevant à 10 714 millions de dollars E.-U., comprend les activités programmées de 10 274,5 millions de dollars E.-U. ; une réserve des opérations de 427,5 millions de dollars E.-U. ; et 12 millions de dollars E.-U. pour le Programme des administrateurs auxiliaires, comme indiqué dans l'annexe I.

9. L'analyse financière préliminaire pour 2022, faite sur la base des chiffres provisoires en attendant la clôture des comptes, est présentée ci-dessous et résumée au tableau II.3.

10. Le montant provisoire des fonds disponibles pour l'exercice clos le 31 décembre 2022 s'élève à 6 130,6 millions de dollars E.-U. Ce montant comprend :

- 235,3 millions de dollars E.-U. de report de l'exercice de 2021 ;
- 5 835,8 millions de dollars E.-U. de contributions volontaires enregistrées en 2022, plus 217,7 millions de dollars E.-U. enregistrés dans les années antérieures pour les activités à mener en 2022 moins 231,5 millions de dollars E.-U. enregistrés en 2022 pour les activités à mener dans les années futures ;
- 42,2 millions de dollars E.-U. alloués au HCR du budget ordinaire des Nations Unies ;
- 31 millions de dollars E.-U. estimés actuellement d'autres fonds disponibles et ajustements, surtout des annulations et ajustements de l'année antérieure, ainsi que des revenus divers.

11. Par rapport aux 5 153,3 millions de dollars E.-U. de fonds disponibles en 2021, le montant provisoire des fonds disponibles en 2022 a augmenté d'environ 977,3 millions de dollars E.-U., soit de 18,9 %.

12. La comparaison entre le total des fonds disponibles de 6 130,6 millions de dollars E.-U. en 2022 et le total des besoins finaux de 10 714 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la même année dégage un déficit financier de 4 583,4 millions de dollars E.-U., soit 42,8 % du total des besoins.

13. Les dépenses provisoires s'élèvent à 5 599,3 millions de dollars E.-U., niveau record pour le HCR ce qui traduit une augmentation de 681,3 millions de dollars E.-U., soit d'environ 13,9 % par rapport au chiffre de 2021 qui était de 4 918 millions de dollars E.-U.

14. Le report en 2023 est estimé à 531,3 millions de dollars E.-U., consistant uniquement en de fonds affectés à des opérations spécifiques.

### III. Aperçu de 2023

#### Total des besoins

15. Le budget annuel initial de 2023, approuvé en octobre 2022 par le Comité exécutif à sa soixante-treizième session plénière, s'élevait à 10 211,3 millions de dollars E.-U.<sup>4</sup>

#### Budgets supplémentaires

16. Au 31 janvier, date butoir pour le présent rapport, le Haut-Commissaire avait établi deux budgets supplémentaires pour 2023 s'élevant à 305,8 millions de dollars E.-U. dont 250 millions pour la situation en Ukraine et 55,8 millions pour la situation liée aux inondations au Pakistan, ce qui porte le total du budget actuel de 2023 à 10 417,1 millions de dollars E.-U. Une répartition en 2023 des budgets supplémentaires par situation, région et domaine d'impact est fournie dans l'annexe III b).

#### Réduction budgétaire

17. Dans le budget initial, le budget annuel de 2023 pour l'Iraq était de 339,9 millions de dollars E.-U. Ce montant a été réduit de 100 millions de dollars E.-U., pour se situer à 239,9 millions de dollars E.-U., afin de traduire l'alignement du programme du HCR sur le Plan-cadre de coopération des Nations Unies pour le développement durable, avec un plus grand accent sur les plans nationaux et les interventions de développements. Au cours des prochaines années, le HCR apportera de plus en plus son appui au renforcement de la capacité des institutions publiques à fournir les services nécessaires.

## Domaines d'impact

18. Les budgets initial et actuel de 2023 sont présentés par domaine d'impact au tableau III.1 ci-dessous qui montre l'effet net des deux budgets supplémentaires, de la réduction budgétaire pour l'opération en Iraq, ainsi que des transferts internes et des ajustements effectués par le Haut-Commissaire conformément à l'article 208.2 du Règlement de gestion.<sup>5</sup> En raison de ces ajustements, le budget alloué au domaine d'impact 1 (créer un environnement de protection favorable) a augmenté de 160,8 millions de dollars E.-U., soit 6,6 %. Les chiffres détaillés des budgets initial et actuel de 2023 sont fournis dans l'annexe VII.

19. La réponse des Etats membres à la Commission spéciale de l'Assemblée générale pour les annonces de contributions volontaires au Programme du Haut-Commissaire des Nations Unies pour les réfugiés (Conférence d'annonce de contributions) de décembre 2022 a confirmé leur engagement constant à soutenir les programmes vitaux du HCR. Les premières contributions annoncées pour 2023 ont atteint 1 135 millions de dollars E.-U. Même si ce montant ne couvre pas l'intégralité des besoins évalués des personnes relevant de la compétence du HCR, il permet à celui-ci de planifier et de poursuivre ses opérations assurant l'assistance vitale et la protection sans interruption. Les donateurs sont encouragés à continuer de répondre généreusement à l'appel du Haut-Commissaire pour des ressources nécessaires en vue de satisfaire les besoins de 2023, notamment au moyen de fonds non affectés.

For the purposes of UNHCR statistics, this population includes only conflict-generated internally displaced persons to whom the Office extends protection and/or assistance.

<sup>9</sup> Refers to persons who are not considered as nationals by any State under the operation of its law. This category refers to persons who fall under the agency's statelessness mandate because they are stateless according to this international definition, but data from some countries may also include persons with undetermined nationality. The figure reported includes stateless persons who are also refugees or asylum-seekers from Myanmar, internally displaced persons in Myanmar, or others of concern to UNHCR. The UNHCR statistical reporting generally follows a methodology that reports on one legal status for each person of concern only. However, due to the extraordinary size of the displaced stateless population from Myanmar, UNHCR considers it important to reflect the dual status that this population group possesses. Additional stateless refugees, asylum-seekers and internally displaced persons will be reported on as UNHCR continues to review and improve its reporting on stateless persons with a dual status.

The statistics on asylum-seekers (new applications, re-opened/repeat applications and/or appeal application) and refugees individually recognized in Canada include persons who had their claim assessed before the Refugee Protection Division and the Refugee Appeal Division of the Immigration Refugee Board as well as by the Department of Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada through a Pre-Removal Risk Assessment.

<sup>18</sup> The number of other people in need of international protection is estimated from the Refugee and Migrant Response Plan.

<sup>19</sup> The Indo-Chinese population in China is no longer considered as refugees under UNHCR mandate and removed from UNHCR statistical report since June 2022, because they have full access to public services and enjoy the same rights as nationals.

<sup>20</sup> The National Victims Registry of Colombia contains the historical accumulated figure of the number of victims of displacement, which continues to increase given that victims continue to be registered in the country. Thus, the total number of people recognized as victims of displacement (more than 8.2 million), includes the number of internally displaced persons who are subject to attention and/or reparation, i.e. those who meet the requirements to access the measures of attention and reparation established in Colombian Law 1448 (6.7 million). The number of victims of displacement who are deceased, or internally displaced persons who were victims of homicide or forced disappearance, and other victims who, for various reasons, cannot effectively access these measures, are identified as not being subject to attention or reparation and therefore not included in the figure of 6.7 million. The figure is constantly updated, considering that by legal definition, victims have up to two years to make their declaration and be included in the registry system. <sup>23</sup> The 2014 ministerial declaration that offered *prima facie* refugee status to persons fleeing generalized violence from Central African Republic from January 2013 onwards is no longer applicable. As such, all refugees are assessed on an individual basis by the National Commission for Refugees.

<sup>24</sup> UNHCR is currently working with the authorities and other actors to determine the size of the population that found an effective nationality solution under Law 169-14. Since the adoption of Law 169-14 in May 2014, important steps have been taken by the Dominican Republic to confirm Dominican nationality through the validation of birth certificates of individuals born in the country to two migrant parents before 2007. According to information shared by the Dominican delegation during the 2019 High-Level Segment on Statelessness, approximately 48 per cent of the total Group A population of 61,049 persons had been authorized by the National Electoral Board to request their nationality documentation. Additionally, as of December 2019, over 1,700 Group B persons (900 of which were children) had submitted applications for naturalization to the Ministry of Interior and of the Police. However, no naturalization decisions concerning this population had been issued by June 2022.

<sup>31</sup> With respect to persons under the UNHCR statelessness mandate, this figure includes persons of concern covered by two separate Latvian laws. 164 persons fall under the Republic of Latvia's Law on Stateless Persons on 17 February 2004. 195,190 of the persons fall under Latvia's 25 April 1995 Law on the Status of those Former Union of Soviet Socialist Republics (USSR) citizens who are not citizens of Latvia or any other State ("non-citizens"). In the specific context of Latvia, the "non-citizens" enjoy the right to reside in Latvia *ex lege* and a set of rights and obligations generally beyond the rights prescribed by the 1954 Convention relating to the Status of Stateless Persons, including protection from removal, and as such the "non-citizens" may currently be considered persons to whom the Convention does not apply in accordance with Article 1.2(ii).

<sup>46</sup> The figure represents a rudimentary estimate of *in situ* stateless persons. These estimates were provided by representatives from these unrecognized communities. The estimated figures have not been verified or confirmed by the Government of Uganda and UNHCR, and UNHCR is planning to support government efforts to gather official statistics on stateless persons and persons of undetermined nationality in Uganda.

<sup>47</sup> UNHCR continues to report on the 2,345 refugees, 1,325 asylum-seekers and 36,459 stateless people until their status and whereabouts can be ascertained. <sup>48</sup> The United Kingdom's stateless figures show the number of stateless individuals recognized through the United Kingdom's stateless determination procedure since it began in 2013. In previous years, this figure has been calculated by adding all grants of stateless leave. This resulted in unavoidable double counting for stateless individuals who were applying for further statelessness leave after the expiry of their initial grant of leave. The United Kingdom Government has now

provided data for initial and subsequent grants. The subsequent grants have therefore been removed from the previous cumulative figure between 2013 and 2018. Since 2019, the cumulative figure now only includes initial grants of leave following individuals' recognition as stateless. At the end of 2021, the total number of individuals recognized under the United Kingdom's statelessness determination procedure is 293. UNHCR further provides the number of asylum-seekers and refugees whose nationality has been recorded as "stateless" as part of the asylum process. For this group, there has been no formal determination that they are stateless.

*Rappelle* qu'à sa soixante-douzième session, le Comité exécutif a approuvé les programmes et les budgets initiaux pour les programmes régionaux, les programmes globaux et le Siège dans le cadre du Budget-programme annuel de 2022 du HCR, s'élevant à 8 993,7 millions de dollars E.-U. ;

*Note* que les budgets supplémentaires finaux de 2022 s'élèvent à 1 720,3 millions de dollars E.-U. pour les programmes et projets du HCR ;

*Prend note* de l'augmentation du budget annuel du HCR de 2022, dont le total final s'élève à 10 714 millions de dollars E.-U., représentant la somme du budget initial de 8 993,7 millions de dollars E.-U. et des budgets supplémentaires finaux de 1 720,3 millions de dollars E.-U. ;

*Rappelle* qu'à sa soixante-treizième session plénière en octobre 2022, le Comité exécutif a approuvé les programmes et les budgets initiaux pour les programmes régionaux, les programmes globaux et le Siège dans le cadre du Budget-programme annuel de 2023 du HCR, s'élevant à 10 211,3 millions de dollars E.-U. (A/AC.96/1224) ;

*Prend acte* de l'augmentation du budget annuel de 2023 du HCR, dont le total actuel s'élève à 10 417,1 millions de dollars E.-U. au 31 janvier 2023, représentant la somme du budget initial de 10 211,3 millions de dollars E.-U. et des budgets supplémentaires de 305,8 millions de dollars E.-U., avec une réduction budgétaire de 100 millions de dollars E.-U. ;

*Considère* qu'en cas de situations d'urgence et d'activités imprévues en 2023, les budgets supplémentaires pourraient être complétés ou élargis, et que des ressources additionnelles, en sus de celles des budgets existants, pourraient être nécessaires pour répondre aux nouveaux besoins ; et

*Exhorte* les États membres à continuer de répondre généreusement, dans un esprit de solidarité et en temps voulu, à l'appel du Haut-Commissaire pour des ressources en vue d'exécuter pleinement le budget annuel de 2023.
