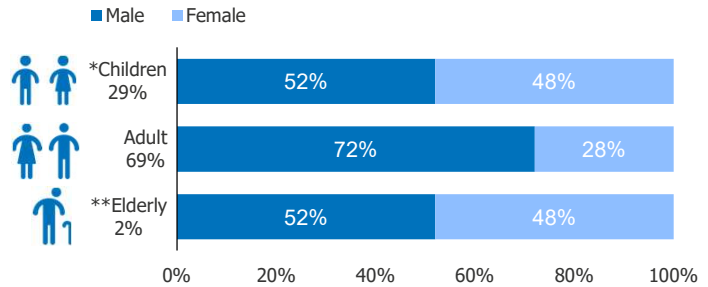

*\*Between 0-17 years old \*\* Above 60 years old*

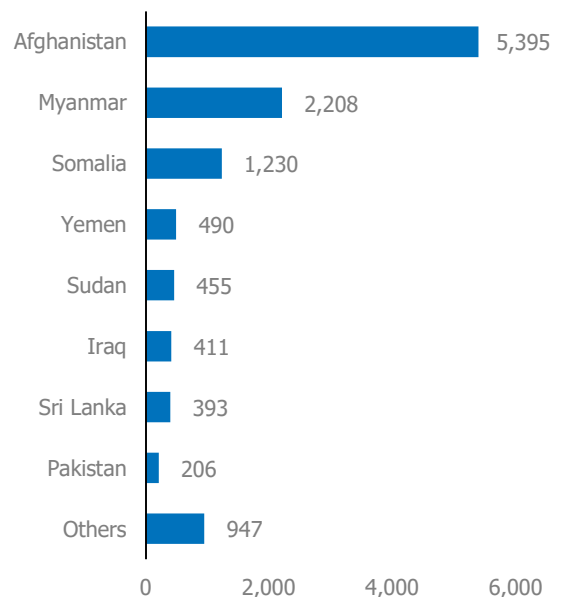
**Locations of Persons Registered with UNHCR**



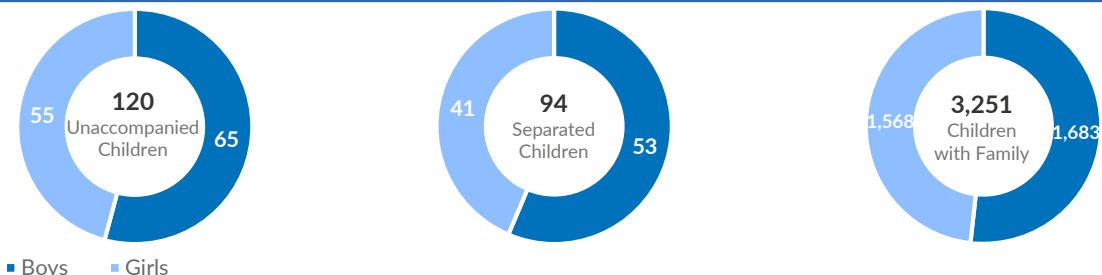

**Population based on Country of Origin**

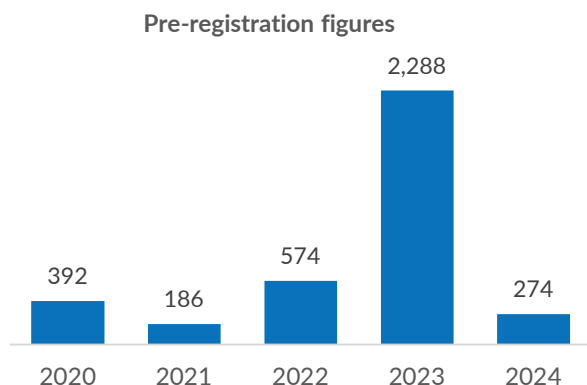


## Children Registered with UNHCR

At the end of September, there are 3,465 children registered with UNHCR, including 3,251 children in Indonesia with a parent or traditional caretaker, 120 children who are unaccompanied by a parent or other adult relative, and 94 children who are separated from their parents but living with an adult caregiver. Together with our partners, UNHCR is working to ensure all refugee children have access to an education, and as of September some 769 refugee children are enrolled in accredited national schools.






## Rohingya Boat Arrivals

Rohingya refugees have undertaken perilous sea journeys from Myanmar and Bangladesh seeking safety, family reunification, and access to livelihoods and education for years. Since 2023, 2,562 Rohingya refugees (the majority of whom are women and children) have landed in Aceh and North Sumatra, Indonesia. While the number of arrivals remains small, more Rohingya have arrived by boat to Indonesia in 2023 and 2024 than arrived in the previous eight years combined. The sea journey remains a dangerous one, with over 1,000 Rohingya deaths at sea in 2022 and 2023.
