




Total funds available increased by \$1,027 million in 2022






2022 Expenditure across regions, GP and HQ

UNHCR expended \$ 1,496 M through partners, 57% to local & national partners



In US\$ millions





Update on Afghanistan situation



3.25 million IDPs



5.2 million registered refugees, refugee like and asylum seekers in **neighboring countries, with** majority **hosted** by Islamic Republics of Iran & Pakistan



1.6 million new arrivals since August 2021

In Afghanistan:



UNHCR supported 259,000 people in 31 provinces



111,600 individuals assisted with cash based interventions



148,000 received in-kind and other individual assistance, including shelter, CRIs



Update on Sudan Situation



Over 1.43 million displaced within Sudan



Some **404,000 refugees, asylum seekers and returnees** in neighboring countries



In Chad and Central African Republic some 15,000 people were moved to more secure locations and provided emergency assistance



In Egypt UNHCR provided 160,000 hygiene kits, 80,000 sanitary napkins, cash to some 800 most vulnerable families



In Sudan some 8,500 families received non-food items
