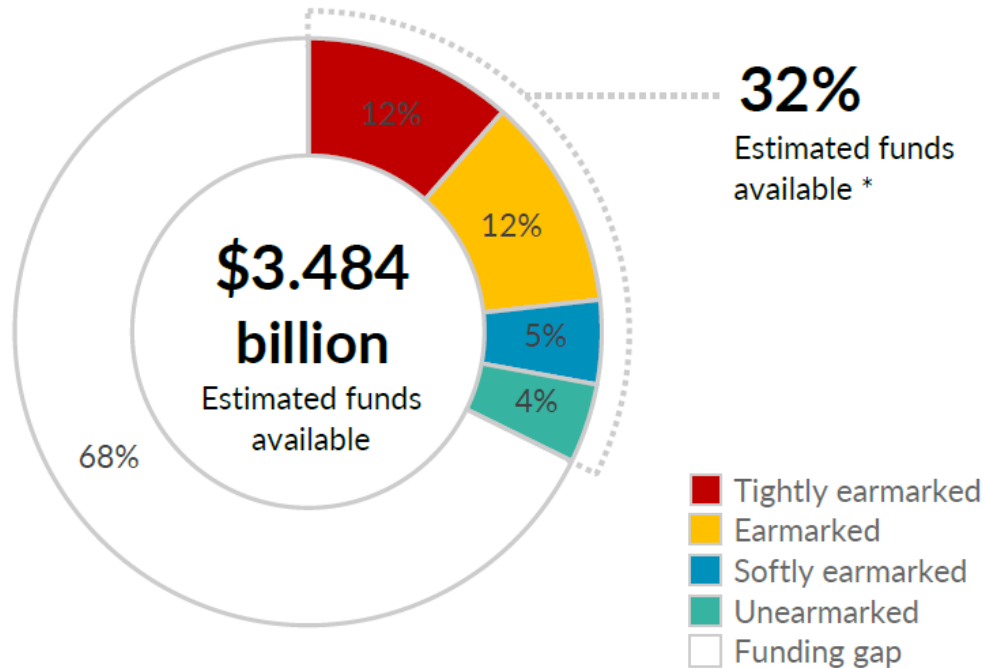

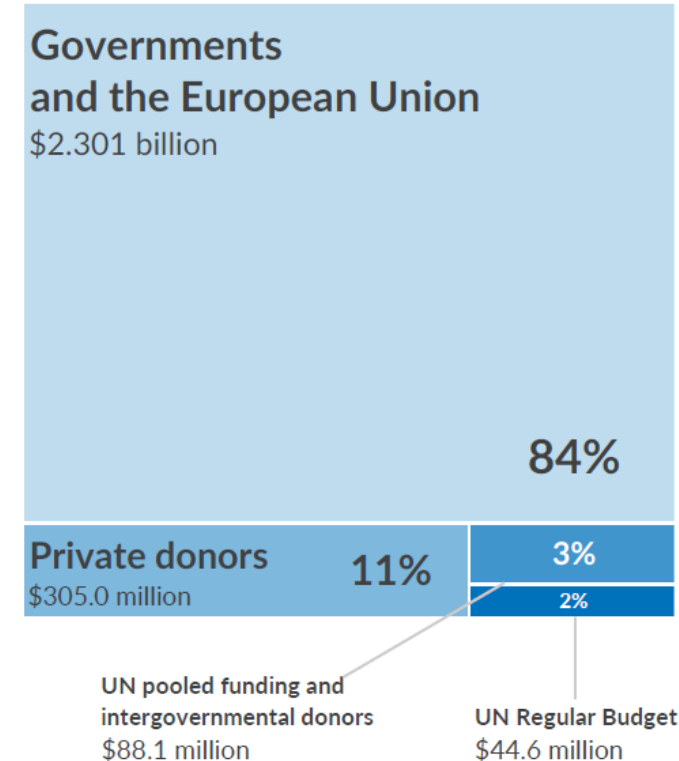

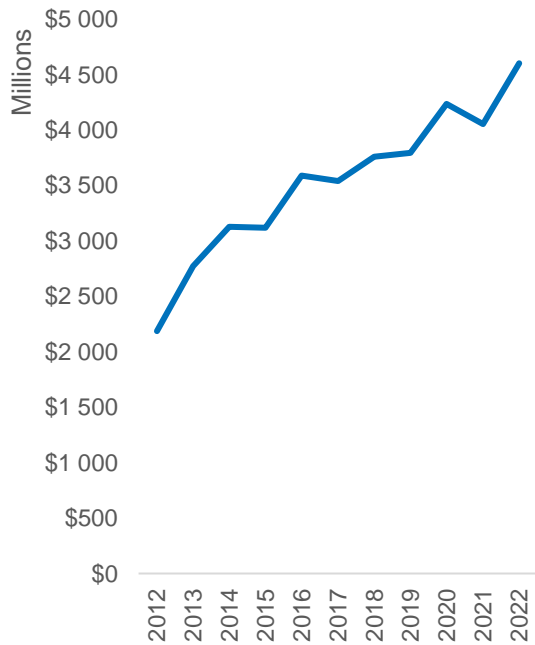

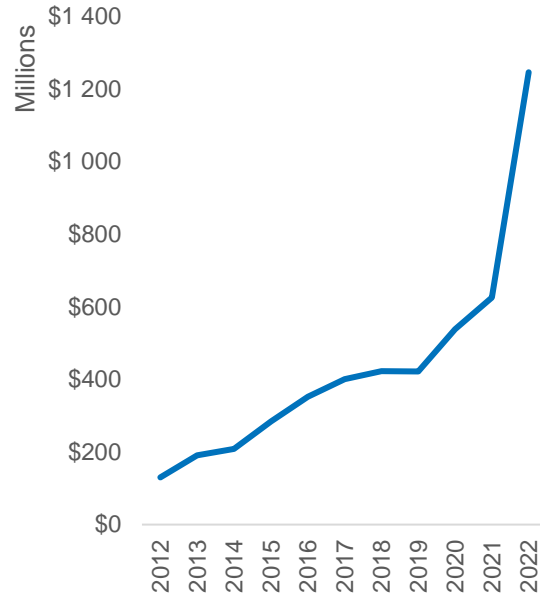

Public sector income



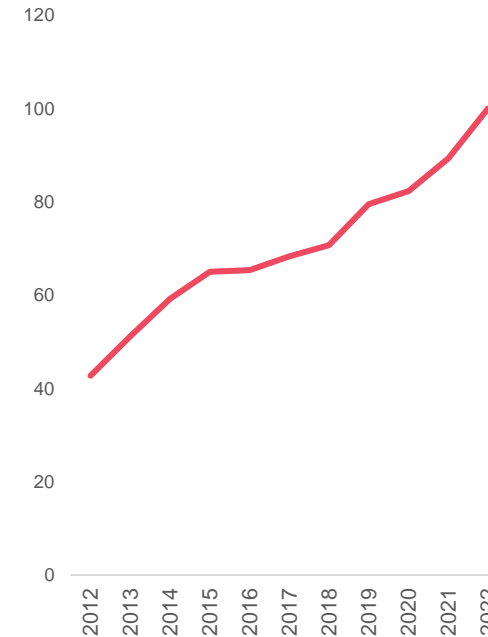
Private sector

Private sector income



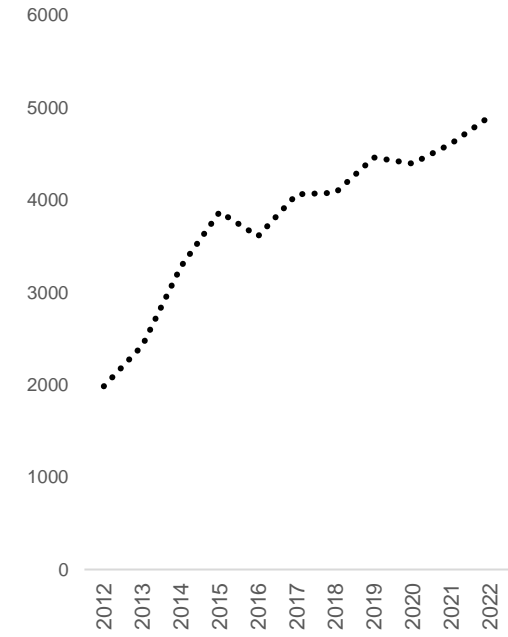
Needs growing faster

Number of refugees, stateless and internally displaced

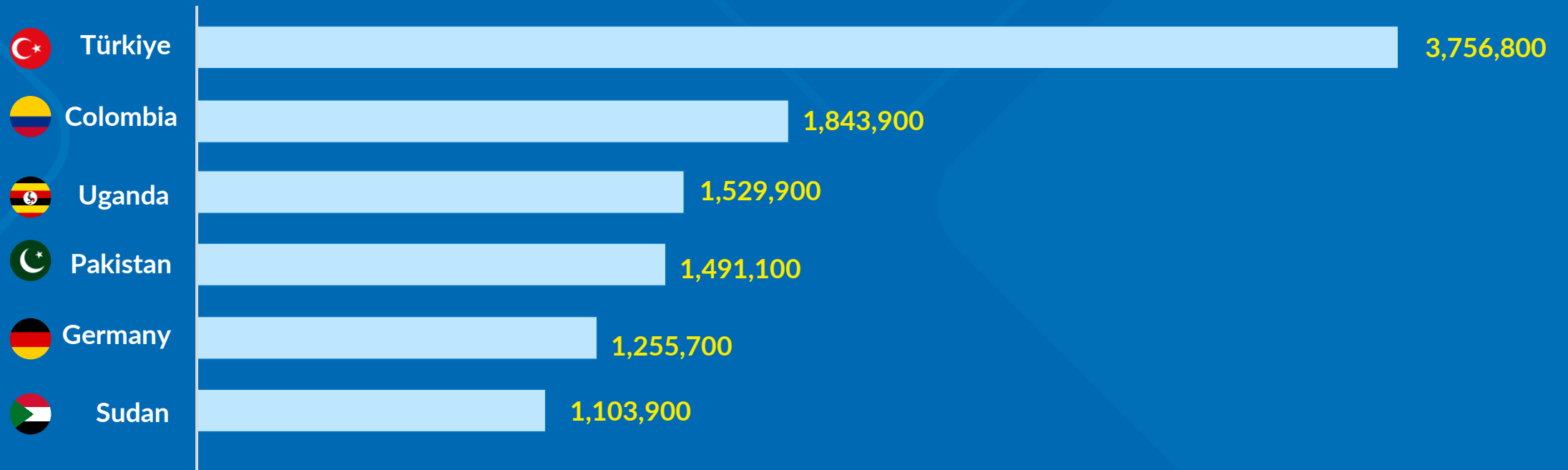


Growing gap

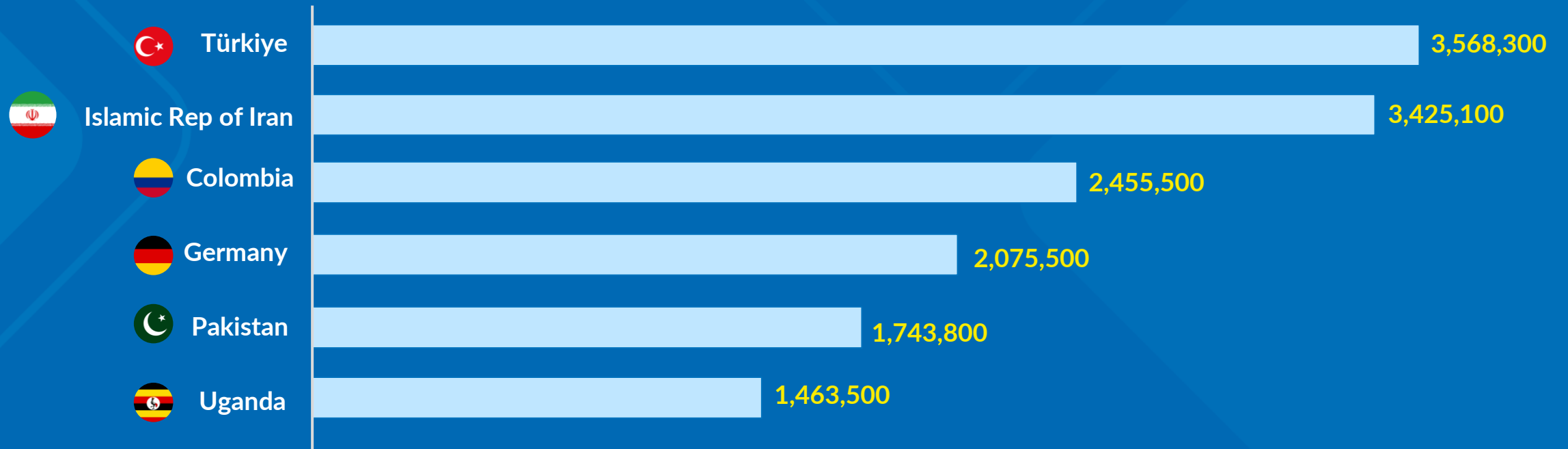
Budget gap (USD million)
