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UPDATE ON PROGRAMME BUDGETS AND FUNDING FOR 2006

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The information presented in this document concerns UNHCR's programme requirements and funding situation as of mid-August 2006. These are summarized in Annex 1. Annexes II and III provide lists of transfers from the 2006 Operational Reserve Categories I and II respectively, and Annex IV lists total contributions received as of 31 July for UNHCR programmes in 2006. A breakdown of these contributions by non-governmental organizations (NGOs), foundations and private donors is provided in Annex V. Information on refugee populations and changes according to available statistics covering the period 1 January to 30 June 2006 is provided in Annex VI.

II. 2006 PROGRAMME BUDGETS AND FUNDING

2. Total budgets for 2006 currently amount to \$1,469.9 million (Annex I, column 2), comprising \$1,136.8 million under the Annual Programme Budget (including \$32.9 million under the United Nations Regular Budget), \$10.0 million for Junior Professional Officers (JPOs) and \$323.1 million under seventeen Supplementary Programme Budgets.

A. Annual Budget

- 3. At its 56th session in October 2005, the Executive Committee approved programmed activities under the 2006 Annual Programme Budget of \$1,011.0 million (A/AC.96/1011), including an allocation of \$32.9 million from the United Nations Regular Budget. Additional provisions were approved under the Operational Reserve Categories I and II of \$125.8 million, comprising \$75.8 million, or 7.5 per cent of the programmed activities, under Operational Reserve Category I, and \$50 million under Operational Reserve Category II. The Executive Committee also took note of \$8.5 million in budgeted activities for JPOs, bringing total requirements to \$1,145.3 million (Annex I, column 1). The JPO budget was subsequently revised upwards by \$1.5 million during the first quarter of the year, bringing total Annual Programme Budget revised requirements to \$1,146.8 million (Annex I, column 2). Estimated expenditure stood at \$480.7 million as at 31 July 2006 (Annex I, column 3).
- 4. Transfers from the 2006 Operational Reserves are shown in Annexes II and III. Transfers from Category I total \$17.9 million and include some \$9.1 million for Africa. Transfers from Category II total \$32.3 million. Thus, as at 31 July 2006, the balance under Category I stood at \$57.9 million and under Category II at \$17.7 million (Annex I, column 2).

- 5. With \$786.1 million so far received in contributions (including \$26.3 million under the Operational Reserve Category II, \$30.7 million under the Regular Budget and \$5.8 million under the JPO Fund), and a carry-over from 2005 of \$15.9 million, the total amount of funds available under the Annual Programme Budget as at 15 August 2006 stood at \$802.0 million. For the Annual Programme Budget to be fully funded, UNHCR would therefore need to receive further income of \$344.8 million during the remainder of 2006. However, projections for further income currently amount to only \$148.2 million. This estimate includes projected contributions of \$101.7 million under the Annual Budget, \$2.2 million under the Regular Budget, \$3.8 million under the JPO Fund and projected miscellaneous income of \$52.7 million (of which the seven per cent Supplementary Budget Support costs are estimated at \$13.0 million) and the reimbursement of the loan from the Working Capital and Guarantee Fund of \$12.2 million. It excludes further contributions to Operational Reserve Category II. Therefore, the projected budgetary shortfall against the 2006 Executive Committee approved budget is \$196.6 million (Annex I, columns 4 to 9).
- 6. As already noted in previous updates provided to the Standing Committee, the expected funding shortfall in 2006 required the imposition of a 20 per cent cap on the 2006 Executive Committee approved programme budgets (including the Operational Reserve Category I) and non-staff administrative cost budgets. Subsequently, the Operational Reserve Category I was further capped by \$20 million, and an Austerity Board identified an additional \$20 million in targeted budgetary reductions in the second quarter of the year, half of which were at Headquarters. These measures, combined with projected exchange rate gains that could reach up to \$20 million, as well as expected increased income from the Central Emergency Response Fund, should result in the Office being able to eliminate the shortfall between projected income and expenditure.

B. Supplementary Programme Budgets

7. Since the approval of the Annual Programme Budget for 2006, 17 Supplementary Programme Budgets have been approved, including nine for internally displaced persons (IDPs), bringing the current total budget for 2006 Supplementary Programmes to \$323.1 million (Annex I, column 2). With a carry-over from 2005 of \$58.7 million, and \$126.9 million so far received in contributions, \$185.6 million were available under the 2006 Supplementary Budget Programmes. Projected further income and transfers amount to \$46.1 million, leaving a projected budgetary shortfall of \$91.4 million (Annex I, column 9). Estimated expenditure stands at \$81.2 million as at 31 July 2006 (Annex I, column 3).

III. CONCLUSION

- 8. The currently foreseen funding shortfalls of \$196.6 under the Annual Programme Budget and \$91.4 million under the Supplementary Programme Budgets over and above outstanding projections of fresh income amounting to \$101.7 million and \$62.1 million, respectively, are of concern, and further measures may need to be introduced over the next few months to limit operational and administrative expenditures.
- 9. Whilst the Office will continue to exercise the utmost care in its use of available resources, donors are urged to provide additional contributions to cover the expected overall funding shortfall and thereby minimize additional disruptions to UNHCR's operations.
