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# Report of the Standing Committee on its ninety-first meeting (12-13 September 2024)\*

### I. Introduction


- 1. The Standing Committee of the Executive Committee of the High Commissioner's Programme (Executive Committee) held its ninety-first meeting in room XVIII at the Palais des Nations on 12-13 September 2024.
- 2. The Chairperson of the Executive Committee, the Permanent Representative of Germany to the United Nations Office at Geneva, opened the ninety-first meeting of the Standing Committee. The Second Vice-Chairperson of the Executive Committee, the Permanent Representative of Australia to the United Nations Office at Geneva, assisted in the chairing of the meeting.

# II. Representation

## IV. Work of the ninety-first meeting

10. At the start of the meeting, the Deputy High Commissioner gave overarching remarks, highlighting the significant transformation that UNHCR has undergone in recent years. She described how UNHCR met humanitarian needs faster and in more efficient ways through

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innovation, data and technology, especially amid new and ongoing emergencies and the rising numbers of forcibly displaced persons worldwide.

11. Presentations under each agenda item were made by senior management of UNHCR, and Executive Committee members and Standing Committee observers were given the opportunity to make comments and ask questions. Comprehensive summary records of the discussion will be made available on the Standing Committee webpage. # V. Decision of the Standing Committee of the Executive Committee of the High Commissioner's Programme

### Decision on budgets and funding for 2024

12. At its meeting, on 12 September 2024, the Standing Committee,

Recalling the Executive Committee's decision, at its seventy-fourth session on administrative, financial and programme matters (A/78/12/Add.1, para. 13 (c)), as well as discussions by the Standing Committee on the programme budgets and funding item at its ninetieth meeting in June 2024,

Reaffirming the importance of responsibility-sharing in solidarity with countries hosting refugees,

- (a) Takes note of the increase in UNHCR's annual budget for 2024 at 31 July 2024 to a current total of \$10,785.4 million, representing the sum of the original budget of \$10,621.7 million and supplementary budget of \$163.7 million;
- (b) Recognizes that emergencies and unforeseen activities unfolding in 2024 may result in the need for additional or expanded supplementary budgets and that additional resources, over and above those for existing budgets, would be needed to meet such needs; and
- (c) Urges Member States to continue to respond generously with flexible and unearmarked contributions, in the spirit of solidarity and in a timely manner, to the High Commissioner's appeal for resources to meet in full the annual budget for 2024.
