It is clear that people who have been through the refugee resettlement process themselves and are closely connected to communities of resettled refugees bring valuable insights about resettlement and settlement/integration issues to our tripartite discussions.

Finally, I would like to extend sincere thanks to Wei-Meng Lim–Kabaa and the UNHCR Resettlement Service team. It has been a pleasure to work with each of you and I look forward to future productive collaboration. Thanks also to Paul Power as the NGO Focal Point. Paul's role reflects the close cooperation and strong partnerships between the government and community sector in Australia. Paul has strongly represented the interests of NGOs locally and internationally and we value his input.

We look forward to continuing to work closely with UNHCR, resettlement countries and our NGO partners into the future and thank you again for your support which has made our year as Chair very rewarding.
