(2019, 2020-2021)****Résumé**

En octobre 2017, le Comité exécutif a approuvé à sa 68^e session un budget annuel initial de 7 352,3 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2019. En octobre 2018, il a approuvé à sa 69^e session un budget révisé de 2019 d'un montant de 8 591,1 millions de dollars E.-U., sur la base des besoins évalués.

En 2019, deux budgets supplémentaires évalués à 107,4 millions de dollars E.-U. ont été établis pour la situation au Cameroun et au Venezuela (République bolivarienne du). En outre, une révision budgétaire de 62,6 millions de dollars a été appliquée pour l'Ouganda, ce qui a porté le budget définitif à 8 635,9 millions de dollars E.-U. au 31 décembre 2019.

En attendant la clôture des comptes annuels, le total des fonds disponibles pour 2019 en janvier 2020 a atteint 4 781,8 millions de dollars E.-U., tandis que le chiffre provisoire des dépenses est de 4 416,6 millions de dollars E.-U. La comparaison du budget annuel final de 2019 aux fonds disponibles provisoires dégage un déficit financier de 3 854,1 millions de dollars E.-U., soit 45 %.

Les budgets annuels initiaux de 2020 et 2021, approuvés par le Comité exécutif à sa 70^e session en octobre 2019, s'élevaient à 8 667,7 millions de dollars E.-U. et 8 615,8 millions de dollars E.-U., respectivement. Au 31 janvier 2020, les totaux pour les budgets annuels actuels pour 2020 et 2021 sont restés inchangés.

Un projet de décision sur les budgets et le financement pour 2019 et pour 2020 et 2021 figure en annexe X.

I. Introduction

1. Le présent document fournit des informations sur les performances financières en 2019¹. Les comptes n'ayant pas encore été clôturés, tous les chiffres de fin d'année pour 2019 sont provisoires. Le document fournit également un aperçu des besoins estimatifs pour l'exercice biennal 2020-2021 au 31 janvier 2020 :

Les budgets révisé et final et les dépenses provisoires de 2019 sont résumés dans l'annexe I.

Les annexes II et III présentent les listes de prélèvements pour les opérations de la Réserve des opérations et de la Réserve pour « activités nouvelles ou additionnelles – liées au mandat » en 2019.

L'annexe IV donne un aperçu des budgets supplémentaires par situation, par région et par sous-région, établis en 2019.

L'annexe V présente l'ensemble des contributions enregistrées pour l'exercice clos le 31 décembre 2019.

L'annexe VI fournit la répartition par pays en 2019 des contributions des organisations non gouvernementales, des fondations et des donateurs privés.

L'annexe VII présente la liste des contributions volontaires non affectées ou légèrement affectées pour le HCR en 2019.

L'annexe VIII montre les budgets initial et actuel de 2020 et 2021 au 31 janvier 2020.

L'annexe IX présente les dernières statistiques disponibles des populations relevant de la compétence du HCR.

L'annexe X présente un projet de décision sur les budgets et le financement pour 2019 et 2020-2021.

2. Le budget annuel final, les chiffres relatifs aux financements et aux dépenses de 2019, qui seront disponibles à la suite de la clôture des comptes le 31 mars 2020, seront annoncés à la soixante-dix-huitième réunion du Comité permanent en juillet 2020.

II. Budgets et financements pour 2019

Budget total

3. À sa soixante-huitième session en octobre 2017, le Comité exécutif a approuvé un budget annuel initial pour 2019 de 7 352,3 millions de dollars E.-U.². À sa soixante-neuvième session en octobre 2018, il a approuvé le budget annuel révisé de 8 591,1 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2019, sur la base des besoins évalués à jour³. Le budget final de 2019, chiffré à 8 635,9 millions de dollars E.-U., représente la somme du budget révisé approuvé de 8 591,1 millions de dollars et des budgets supplémentaires finaux de 107,4 millions de dollars E.-U., établis par le Haut Commissaire en 2019 conformément à l'article 7.5 du règlement de gestion du HCR, avec une réduction budgétaire de 62,6 millions de dollars E.-U.⁴. De plus amples informations sur les budgets révisé et final 2019 sont fournies dans l'annexe I.

Budgets supplémentaires

4. À la soixante-seizième réunion du Comité permanent en septembre 2019, le HCR a annoncé que deux budgets supplémentaires avaient été établis en 2019, s'élevant au total à 107,4 millions de dollars E.-U. au 31 juillet 2019. Ce chiffre est resté depuis lors inchangé.

Réduction budgétaire

5. À la même réunion du Comité permanent en septembre, le budget de 2019 a été réduit de 62,6 millions de dollars E.-U. à la suite de la révision à la baisse des chiffres démographiques de planification pour l'Ouganda concernant les réfugiés du Burundi, de la République démocratique du Congo et du Soudan du Sud.

Répartition par pilier

6. La répartition par pilier du budget annuel final de 2019 est présentée au tableau II.2 ci-dessous.

Analyse financière provisoire en fin d'exercice

7. Le budget annuel final de 2019, s'élevant à 8 635,9 millions de dollars E.-U., comprend les activités programmées de 8 158,9 millions de dollars E.-U. ; une réserve des opérations de 459,4 millions de dollars E.-U. ; une réserve pour « activités nouvelles ou additionnelles – liées au mandat » de 5,6 millions de dollars E.-U. et 12 millions de dollars E.-U. pour le Programme des administrateurs auxiliaires, comme indiqué dans l'annexe I.

8. L'analyse financière provisoire de 2019 est présentée ci-dessous, et résumée au tableau II.3.

9. Le total des fonds disponibles pour l'exercice clos le 31 décembre 2019 s'élève à 4 781,8 millions de dollars E.-U. Ce montant comprend :

- 484,1 millions de dollars E.-U. de report de l'exercice de 2018 ;
- 4 171,2 millions de dollars E.-U. de contributions volontaires enregistrées en 2019, plus 78,4 millions de dollars E.-U. enregistrés dans les années antérieures pour les activités à mener en 2019 moins 98,4 millions de dollars E.-U. enregistrés en 2019 pour les activités à mener dans les années futures, comme présenté dans l'annexe V ;
- 43,3 millions de dollars E.-U. du Budget ordinaire des Nations Unies ;

- 103,2 millions de dollars E.-U. d'autres fonds disponibles et ajustements, principalement des annulations et ajustements de l'exercice antérieur, ainsi que des revenus divers.
10. Par rapport aux 4 710,3 millions de dollars E.-U. de fonds disponibles en 2018, les fonds disponibles provisoires en 2019 ont augmenté d'environ 71,5 millions de dollars E.-U., soit d'un peu moins de 2 %.
11. La comparaison entre le total des fonds disponibles de 4 781,8 millions de dollars E.-U. en 2019 et le total des besoins évalués de 8 635,9 millions de dollars E.-U. pour la même année dégage un déficit financier de 3 854,1 millions de dollars E.-U., soit 45 % du total des besoins.
12. En attendant la clôture des comptes de 2019, les dépenses se chiffrent à 4 416,6 millions de dollars E.-U. Par rapport aux 4 226,3 millions de dollars E.-U. de dépenses enregistrées en 2018, les dépenses ont augmenté en 2019 de 190,3 millions de dollars E.-U., soit d'environ 4,5 %. Cette augmentation est plus importante que celle des fonds disponibles. Un tel niveau de dépenses est un niveau record pour le HCR.
13. Cela étant, le report en 2020 est estimé à 365,3 millions de dollars E.-U. Il intègre les fonds affectés à des opérations spécifiques.

III. Aperçu de 2020-2021

Total des besoins

14. Les budgets annuels initiaux de 2020 et 2021, approuvés par le Comité exécutif à sa soixante-dixième session plénière en octobre 2019, s'élevaient à 8 667,7 millions de dollars E.-U. et 8 615,8 millions de dollars E.-U., respectivement⁵. Étant donné qu'aucun budget supplémentaire n'a été établi au 31 janvier 2020, les budgets annuels actuels pour 2020 et 2021 sont restés inchangés. Un aperçu est disponible dans l'annexe VIII.

Répartition par pilier

15. La répartition par pilier des budgets annuels actuels de 2020 et 2021, intégrant les transferts internes et les ajustements effectués par le Haut Commissaire, conformément à

16. La réponse des donateurs à la Conférence d'annonce de contributions volontaires au Programme du Haut Commissaire (conférence d'annonce de contributions), tenue en décembre 2019, a confirmé l'engagement constant à soutenir les programmes vitaux du HCR. Les premières contributions annoncées pour 2020 ont atteint 883,2 millions de dollars E.-U. Même si ce montant ne couvre pas pleinement les besoins évalués, il permet au HCR de planifier et de poursuivre ses opérations assurant l'assistance vitale et la protection sans interruption. Les donateurs sont encouragés à continuer de répondre généreusement à l'appel du Haut Commissaire pour des ressources en vue de satisfaire les besoins de 2020, notamment par des fonds non affectés.

Le Comité permanent,

Rappelant les décisions prises par le Comité exécutif sur les questions administratives, financières et de programme lors de ses soixante-huitième et soixante-neuvième sessions (A/AC.96/1176, par. 14 et A/AC.96/1187, par. 13), et les débats sur le point consacré aux budgets-programmes et au financement lors de la soixante-sixième réunion du Comité permanent en septembre 2019,

Réaffirmant l'importance du partage des responsabilités, en solidarité avec les pays accueillant les réfugiés,

Rappelle que le Comité exécutif a approuvé, à sa soixante-huitième session, la version initiale des programmes et des budgets pour les programmes régionaux, les programmes globaux et le Siège dans le cadre du Budget-programme biennal 2018-2019 du HCR, s'élevant à 7 508,4 millions de dollars E.-U. et 7 352,3 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2018 et 2019 respectivement ;

Rappelle que le Comité exécutif a approuvé, à sa soixante-neuvième session, la version révisée des programmes et des budgets pour les programmes régionaux, les programmes globaux et le Siège dans le cadre du Budget-programme biennal 2018-2019 du HCR (révisé), s'élevant à 8 275,3 millions de dollars E.-U. et 8 591,1 millions de dollars E.-U. pour 2018 et 2019 respectivement ;

Note que les budgets supplémentaires finaux de 2019 s'élèvent à 107,4 millions de dollars E.-U. pour les programmes globaux en faveur des réfugiés et les projets en faveur des déplacés internes ;

Prend acte de l'augmentation du budget annuel de 2019 du HCR, dont le total définitif s'élève à 8 635,9 millions de dollars E.-U., représentant la somme du budget révisé de 8 591,1 millions de dollars E.-U. et des budgets supplémentaires finaux de 107,4 millions de dollars E.-U., et une réduction budgétaire de 62,6 millions de dollars E.-U.

Rappelle qu'à sa soixante-dixième session en octobre 2019, le Comité exécutif a approuvé les programmes et les budgets initiaux pour les programmes régionaux, les programmes globaux et le Siège dans le cadre du Budget-programme biennal 2020-2021 du HCR, s'élevant à 8 667,7 millions de dollars E.-U. et à 8 615,8 millions de dollars E.-U. respectivement pour 2020 et 2021 (A/AC.96/1198, par. 13 c)) ;

Prend note des budgets annuels du HCR pour 2020 et 2021 au 31 janvier 2020, qui sont restés inchangés par rapport aux montants initialement approuvés par le Comité exécutif ;

Considère qu'en cas de situations d'urgence et d'activités imprévues en 2020, les budgets supplémentaires pourraient être complétés ou élargis, et que des ressources additionnelles, en sus de celles des budgets existants, pourraient être nécessaires pour répondre aux nouveaux besoins ;

Exhorte les États membres à continuer de répondre généreusement, dans un esprit de solidarité et en temps voulu, à l'appel du Haut Commissaire pour des ressources en vue d'exécuter pleinement le budget annuel de 2020.
