OPERATIONAL CONTEXT

- **Active hostilities continue to take a heavy toll on civilians in eastern and southern Ukraine.** Ongoing damage to civilian infrastructure only increases the challenges towards preparing for winter – with more damaged buildings and homes in need of critical repairs.
- [The Government of Ukraine reported on 6 September](#) that **over 60,000 people had been evacuated over the month from Donetsk, Kharkiv, Kherson, Luhansk and Zaporizhka oblasts in east and south** – mainly children, women, people with low mobility and older people, in addition to those who had already evacuated from Donetsk oblast through mandatory evacuation.
- **The security situation in the Zaporizhzhia Nuclear Power Plant (ZNPP) remains tense** and the [Director of IAEA is calling](#) for the creation of a nuclear and physical security zone around the ZNPP.

WEEKLY HIGHLIGHTS

- Support continued to communities most in need who are in heavily affected and hard-to-reach areas. [As part of the UN humanitarian convoy](#), **UNHCR delivered 5 tons of tarpaulin and hygiene kits for 5,000 people in Chasiv Yar and surrounding towns in Donetsk oblast.** These front-line communities have been exposed to continuous shelling and hostilities.
- **400 emergency shelter kits (ESKs) were delivered to the affected areas in Khersonska oblast** to support the rapid repairs of damaged homes. **Over 1,000 ESKs were also delivered to the most hard-hit areas in Dnipropetrovska and Sumska oblasts.** UNHCR aims to distribute 35,000 ESKs benefitting over 100,000 people by the end of the year.
- Distribution of technical equipment such as laptops and working stations to **support capacity of the local social protection authorities** to serve IDPs and conflict affected populations continued in Ivano-Frankivska, Kharkivska, Odeska and Vinnytska oblasts.
- **700 IDPs in collective centres and remote areas** in Zakarpatska and Ivano-Frankivsk oblasts received **winter items such as high thermal blankets, sleeping bags and thermoses** in preparation for colder temperatures.

RESPONSE IN NUMBERS

Over **2.1 million** people reached with assistance to date.

PROTECTION

713,058 people received **targeted protection assistance** and information at border points, transit, and reception centres and through hotlines.



CASH ASSISTANCE

UNHCR has disbursed **cash assistance** to **559,248** individuals to support their basic needs*.



ESSENTIAL ITEMS

815,401 people received essential non-food items, clothes and food assistance.



EMERGENCY SHELTER KITS

31,406 people received emergency shelter materials to protect homes from elements.



ITEM SUPPORT TO CENTRES

106,927 sleeping places were improved with **items such as beds and mattresses** in a total of **387** reception & collective centres.



CONVOYS

154,992 people have received assistance through **258** humanitarian convoys delivered to **hard-hit areas**.



HOUSING

1,001 sleeping places have been newly created or improved through **construction works** at collective centres.

First of many houses repaired as UNHCR scales up winterization programmes

Last week, housing repairs for the first of many houses planned were finished in Makarov, Kyivska oblast to support families with homes damaged by shelling. The repairs included insulating the homes with new roofs and fixing destroyed windows and walls so that families could stay in a warm home during the harsh winter months.

UNHCR is working to repair and insulate some 8,200 homes for the most vulnerable families across the country in preparation for the winter.

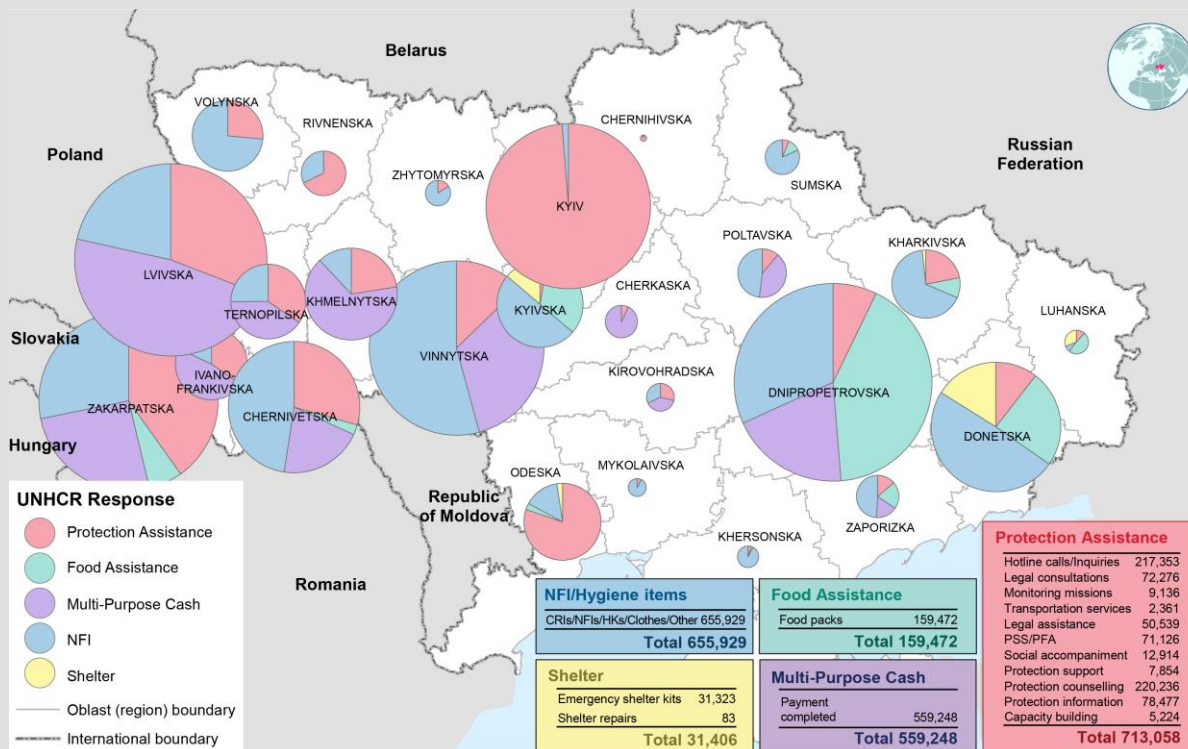

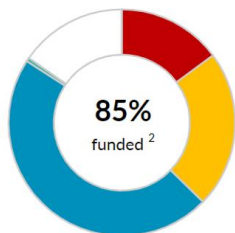
