

## **Thematic Legislative Update**

## On amendments to the payment of IDP allowances

On 26 January 2024, the Cabinet of Ministers adopted Resolution 941 that announced prolongation of the payment of IDP allowances until 1 March 2024 to all IDPs already receiving it. Announcing the decision, the Ministry of Social Policy stated that this is a step in the implementation of the Government's IDP policy, which aims to ensure gradual integration of IDPs in hosting communities, to provide employment stimulus for working age IDPs, and tailor social support to the needs of the displaced population. Such a comprehensive approach is expected to protect IDPs from poverty, support those in need of rented accommodation, provide access to child-care services for families with children, and enhance services for bed-ridden, disabled or other household members in need of social services.

As of 1 March 2024, the state-run IDP allowance will be extended for six months automatically only for specific categories of IDPs as per the table below. Other IDPs must apply, and the six-month extension is subject to review of the socio-economic situation of the household. This will result in some IDPs ceasing to receive the IDP subsistence allowance as of 1 March 2024. The table below details the categories of IDPs who are eligible to continue receiving the IDP subsistence allowance after 1 March 2024.

*Applying is possible as of 1 February!	

The Resolution also introduces the possibility to apply for financial assistance from the state for returning refugees. An amendment is made to Resolution 250 of 24 February 2003 on assistance to low-income families. The introduced provision suggests provision of financial assistance to individuals who stayed abroad for more than 90 days and who upon return registered in an employment center or otherwise work on ensuring sustainable income. The amount of assistance is calculated for each household and depends on the difference between minimum subsistence allowance set by the state and the monthly family income of an applicant.
