2.2 Administrative/Biographical history The UNHCR Branch Office in Lisbon opened in

November 1977. Prior to this, UNHCR assistance activities were

channelled through the volunteer agency, Santa Casa de

Misericordia de Lisboa. The principle recipients of this assistance were Latin American refugees from Chile and Brazil. Following the outbreak of civil war in Angola and independence in the former Portuguese colonies in Africa, from 1975 on large numbers of "returnees", both Portuguese and non-Portuguese citizens, arrived in Portugal. A small number of these were recognized as refugees under the UNHCR mandate; they were assisted under the same programmes as those destined for the Latin American refugees.

The Branch Office in Lisbon was closed in December 1998.

2.4 Immediate source of acquisition The records were transferred to UNHCR Archives in

February 1999. From the total transfer, 18 boxes of books and publications were transferred to UNHCR Center for Documentation

and Research (CDR).

3.1 Scope and content The records contain general correspondence as well as programme

and protection files from UNHCR Branch Office in Lisbon. The

records include individual refugee case files.
